

Youth Baseball Homerun Derby & All-Star Selections

Homerun Derby Selections:

- All coaches, from their own team, will vote and select two (2) players to advance to the homerun derby.
- If there's a tie among the players the head coach will be the tie breaker.

All-Star Game Player Selections:

- All coaches, from their own team, will vote and select the number amount of players indicated below to participate in the All-Star Game.
- If there's a tie among the players the head coach will be the tie breaker.
- The teams will be divided in the following way:
 - **Minor Divisions**
 - West Team – 1st and 4th Place Teams
 - East Team – 2nd and 3rd Place Teams
 - **Rookie Division**
 - West Team – 1st, 4th & 5th Place Teams
 - East Team – 2nd & 3rd Place Teams
- The manager from each team and one of his assistant coaches will coach the All-Star Team.
- The managers of the All-Star teams will be the 1st place team coach and the 2nd place team coach. Each team will have a total of four (4) coaches and one team parent.

Homerun Derby Rules: Three Rounds of Play

First Round:

1. All participants will compete in the first round of the home run derby.
2. Batting order will be selected by city staff for the first round only.
3. Each participant will receive one point for each home run hit over the fence or over the line in fair territory.
4. Batters do not have to swing at every pitch.
5. Each swing not resulting in a homerun will be referred to as an out.
6. Each batter will hit until he has recorded ten (10) outs.
7. The first round will be completed after all participants have had their turn and have made ten (10) outs.

Second Round:

1. All participants will advance to the second round.
2. The batting order of the 2nd round will be determined by the points that each participant accumulated in the 1st round. The participant with the most homeruns will bat last and the one with the fewest homeruns will bat first. In the event of a tie the participant with the most hits will bat last and the one with the fewest will bat first.
3. The same rules will apply to the Second Round – as the previous round.
4. The Second Round will be completed after all participants have had their turn and have made ten (10) outs.

Final:

1. The top four scores will advance to the Final Round.
2. The batting order of the Final Round will be determined by the points that each participant accumulated in the 1st and 2nd rounds. The participant with the most homeruns will bat last and the one with the fewest homeruns will bat first. In the event of a tie the participant with the most hits will bat last and the one with the fewest will bat first.
3. The same rules will apply to the Final Round – as the previous round.
4. Each batter will hit until he has recorded five (5) outs.
5. In the event of a tie, all tied participants will take place in a “swing off” – where they will each receive three (3) “outs”. The participant (s) with the most points after the “swing off” will be determined the winner of the 2015 Homerun Derby. If a tie still remains after the “swing off” the tie breaking procedure will keep going until there is one winner.
